

As I sit here this morning, reflecting on the last two years, I am absolutely overwhelmed with gratitude. It was just three years ago when I walked into this building a broken man. Angry, lost, confused, underweight and destitute. Bill Little and Joe Gallow immediately met me with kindness, patience and understanding. I was given some chores to do and a mat to sleep on. I started participating in the program having no idea what to expect, only that I didn't know what else to do. This was the first time in my life I ever had more questions than answers.

One night on the chapel floor, after not sleeping for 10 weeks, I prayed. It went something like "I don't care what you want from me, I'll do it. I can't do this anymore." I immediately fell into a deep, restful sleep. I woke up convinced that there was a living God looking out for me. I started asking questions, asking anyone who would listen. Tom Giglio, Diane Young, Nate Towers, Kevin Gillespie, Daniel Webb and others not only listened to my questions, but answered me honestly. Fair to say these were new experiences.

While here, I was able to deal with my issues of anger, family, faith and work. My issues had issues!

As I approached graduation, I was offered an internship. My first response was "thanks, but no thanks. I've got stuff to do." I can imagine God placing His head in His hand at this. But I was warned by Bill Little and Dr. Dan Berardesco (aka Dan the van man) not to dismiss the idea outright. They expressed to me that service to others brought with it



a fulfillment straight from the Lord and that in time my life's trajectory might alter dramatically.

Needless to say, they were right. Under the guidance of George Moussab, Phil Richards, Chaplain Gregory Cole and Patrick Tansey, I found a joy I had never known before – ministering to men who were just like I had been. I started seeking out different career paths, becoming increasingly convinced that I would not go back to truck driving.

So here we are in office 42, at 6:30 a.m., at the tail end of two years in which I have seen, heard and smelled things I will never forget. With the help and guidance of MSM and JSRM, I've been ordained as a chaplain, and am well on my way to becoming a substance abuse counselor. My life looks absolutely nothing like it did three or even two years ago.

I have tasted the joy and peace of the Lord, and I really wish I had a better word than gratitude to describe how I feel. It feels bigger than that. This has been an experience that I will never forget, and it has given me stories that are etched in my mind with feelings of unmitigated joy. It has been an honor to serve with you.
