ne day, Rob's father sat him down and said, "Your mother asked me to leave."
Rob was confused; he was adopted and had grown up in this close, loving family, where he was well-taken-care-of. But he learned that his father was unfaithful to his mother, which left her devastated – and left Rob upset with the pain his father caused.

At age 14, full of growing resentment, Rob started drinking with his friends, which soon led to becoming an alcoholic. Alcoholism, however, did not keep Rob from success. He got a great job out of high school, and his rock band was nearly famous. He got married, had three children, and enjoyed the money he made.

Eventually his paycheck made him materialistic, and the constant yearning for more – combined with resentment and the new stress of caring for his sick mother – caught up with him. His drinking worsened, and he ended up in the hospital from alcohol poisoning.

Though they rarely spoke, Rob called his father. He told Rob he needed to change, and recommended the recovery program at the Market Street Mission.

Not yet ready to commit, Rob began as an overnight guest for a week. But as he walked around Morristown with trash bags full of clothes, he asked himself what he was doing. He decided to follow his father's advice and give the program a try.

The first month was an emotional struggle, but when Rob talked to his counselor, she suggested he pray on it. And when he started praying, everything changed.



"I didn't come here to find God," he said, "but when I slept on that chapel floor and prayed to that cross, I begged Him to make me well."

Rob had always tried to find healing through his own power, but now he knows that God is the only one who can truly change his life. "He's making me into who He meant for me to be."

Now, Rob has graduated our program and serves as a Mission Intern, working at our thrift store and leading worship music at Celebrate Recovery every Thursday night. Moving forward, he has two goals: deepen his relationship with his three sons, and spread the message of the Lord's hope and healing to people who are struggling like he once was.

It's going to be a Christmas filled with joy for Rob – and he is so grateful to you for this wonderful gift of a new life. "I hope people find what I found at the Mission."




We <u>Need</u> Your Help

Hi, it's nice to meet you.

I am a graduate of the Market Street Mission's Life Change Program and the current Site Manager of Market Street's newest location in Sussex County. In our first months of operation, we have witnessed the difficulties facing many in this area and are honored to stretch out our helping hands toward Sussex County. In June of 2021, we opened a 14-bed hospitality room that provides shelter, meals, showers and addiction services to men in need.

We received an immediate outpouring of support and encouragement from the county, its partnering agencies, the local community, volunteers and donors such as yourselves. What an absolute blessing it has been.

By God's grace, we have already provided multiple evenings of shelter to various homeless men, weekly showers for a family in need, and many hot meals to quiet rumbling stomachs. We even helped a gentleman named Jim, who was in the throes of addiction, get off the streets of Newton and enrolled into our long-term residential program in Morristown. Praise the Lord. Finding HIS WAY Home

A few months ago, Jim was homeless and struggling with addiction, couch-surfing with friends and running out of places to stay. He had grown up in a Christian home but had left his faith behind... until one day, when he read about the new Market Street Mission – Sussex County in the local newspaper.

That day, Jim rededicated his life to Christ.

"Learning of the Mission's Christ-based 12-step approach and meeting [Site Manager] Jacob through the article ignited a long-dormant spark in me," he says.

After that, Jim came to our Sussex location as an overnight guest.

"It filled me with hope," he says. "From 2018 through 2021, my hope had steadily declined. I lost

my mom to COVID in May of 2020. Then, a mere 37 weeks later, my dad passed. By the middle of 2021, I had hit the low point of my life. But all of that changed when I entered the Mission. Great food, inspiring conversation, a warm shower, and a comfortable mat to sleep on greeted me upon my arrival. Hope had started to return, and it truly felt like my recovery had begun."

After five nights in Sussex, Jim came to Morristown to begin our addiction recovery Life Change Program, where he is pursuing both his recovery and his relationship with Jesus.

"I am so grateful for the staff, the leadership, and my fellow classmates in the Life Change Program," he says. "Market Street Mission saved my life."
