

Andrew grew up in Florida with hard-working parents who always put food on the table. But God wasn't a thought in their household, and Andrew experienced abuse as a child.

"By the age of 9, I remember looking in the mirror and asking myself, 'What is wrong with me? Why does everybody hate me?"

Because of that pain, he turned to the streets. Drawn in by hip-hop music, he felt accepted by the people who listened to it. But he was young and impressionable, and was influenced to start drinking and using drugs.

From that point, Andrew was in and out of jail for years. Although he was introduced to God in jail and tried on his own to get sober, he always returned to his old behaviors when he was released.

At his lowest point, Andrew ended up homeless in Hackensack, feeling broken and alone.

He checked himself into the hospital, where a staff member began talking to him about his faith, and Andrew started feeling God's presence in a new way. While there, he heard about the Mission's recovery program, and thought it aligned with his goals.

In our program, through counseling and classes,

Andrew experienced immense growth as he learned that Jesus came to offer true forgiveness and healing. Thanks to your prayers and support, he graduated our program – the first commitment in his life he completed.

On June 15, we celebrated our first anniversary – one whole year of serving the Sussex County community. What a blessing it has been!

Newton town officials invited us to bring hope and healing in the face of homelessness and substance abuse, and God has opened many doors for us to serve our neighbors in need. We know our Sussex County community is facing real difficulties: in 2021, more than 400 people experienced homelessness, and 31 people died of a drug overdose. These are two of the biggest needs we are trying to meet.

Through our 14-bed hospitality room, we offer safe overnight shelter for men. Along with a warm place to sleep, our guests receive a hot meal, a shower and the opportunity for AA/ NA recovery meetings and pastoral counseling. Furthermore, our staff members are always looking to form relationships with our guests and direct those in need to our long-term

addiction recovery program at our Mission location in Morristown.

Through our programs and services, we hope to not only meet the physical needs of those who walk through our doors, but also to surround our guests with God's love. To offer them the opportunity to pursue the deeper healing they need through His grace and mercy.

When JR got pulled over for driving under the influence, he knew he needed to do something to address his addiction.

Two of his childhood friends, who are now police officers, recommended that he come to the Market Street Mission – Sussex County. He first came to stay with us as an overnight guest. Then when staff members Jacob and Rich told him about our long-term addiction recovery program at our Morristown location, JR knew that was his next step.

"They took me under their wing and placed me where I needed to go," he said. "They are two of the nicest gentlemen and will forever be part of my new, improved life."

When JR arrived at the Market Street Mission in Morristown, he was a bit nervous – he had never been

in a recovery program before. But as he spent time talking to other residents, he began to settle in.

"It feels like home," he said. "Between the AA/NA meetings, Bible studies, work assignments, learning center and counseling sessions, being at the Market Street Mission has changed my whole outlook on life."

Today, JR is working through the phases of our program, and he always tries to encourage new residents when they join. He is grateful that his time in Newton helped begin his journey to recovery at the Mission.

"If you are suffering from addiction to alcohol or drugs, I highly recommend this program," he said. "It is a complete lifesaver. Just remember to take your recovery one day at a time."
